

There is a 'land of mugs' in Romagna, said Leonardo da Vinci while passing through the Romagna region. The tradition of ceramics still practiced today has been passed down through the years and makes use of decorations set in the past but still “in production” nowadays. Bouquets, carnations and flowers are the hand-painted decorations of the tableware, but there are also sacred sculptures (the famous Madonnas) or furnishing accessories.

All this is still produced by the skilled ceramists of the “Cooperativa Ceramica d'Imola” which was founded in the late nineteenth century and is an important part of the productive economy of Imola today.
